Why study this course?

Nurses are in high demand worldwide. We need new highly trained nurses to care for our future patients, and Health Skills Australia can help you develop your career in this rewarding profession with our nationally accredited qualification.

Who should study this course?

This course is suitable for those looking to enter the field of health care as an Enrolled Nurse.

Career outcomes

Enrolled Nurses work in conjunction with Registered Nurses to deliver high quality care to the public in a variety of health care settings, including acute, palliative, aged, rehabilitation, mental health and community care workplaces. This also includes administering intravenous medications and medication administration.

To be registered as an Enrolled Nurse with the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (AHPRA), applicants need to have successfully completed the Diploma of Nursing, and studied for at least 5 years full-time in which they were assessed in English (e.g. secondary school). An International English Language Testing System (IELTS) score of at least 7 in each band or an Occupational English Test (OET) pass with grades A and B are also accepted.

Further study opportunities

Candidates who successfully complete this course may be eligible to articulate to Advanced Diploma or Degree level programs in the nursing and health and community services fields. Applications would be assessed on an individual basis by the education provider.



Entry requirements

Students are required to successfully complete a Maths and English assessment to demonstrate their ability to manage the demands of the course. Students should be willing to undertake a National Police Check and Working with Children Check, as well as immunisations, prior to their first clinical placement.

Course structure

Using industry best practice, specialist training in the latest methods is delivered through a blended model of theory based classroom learning, online and practical hands-on sessions in nursing labs and clinical practicum. Students also gain real life experience during the course through supervised clinical placements in different health care environments.

The Diploma consists of 25 units and is structured as follows:

- Full time 3 days per week in class over 18 months (blended delivery)
- Part time 2 days per week in class over 30 months (blended delivery)
- Up to 15 hours per week of self-directed study

400 hours (minimum) of supervised clinical practicum, with objectives linked to aged care, sub-acute, mental health, palliative and acute care settings.

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) or Credit Transfer (CT)

RPL or CT may be granted to students who have completed units of competency that directly match the health training package units. This will be reviewed on an individual basis, and a 50% tuition fee will apply for any RPL granted. Assessments

Assessments vary and can include presentations, class discussions, assignments, practical demonstrations, short tests, essays, workbooks and case studies. Each unit is assessed in the classroom/practical lab and in the clinical setting to determine a student's competency.
