Articulation is possible to Diploma or Degree level programs, and this is assessed on an individual basis by the educational provider.

Entry requirements

To gain entry into this qualification, candidates must meet one of the following criteria:

- › Be recently appointed or currently working in a community support alcohol and other drugs role, and have a relevant recognised higher education or vocational education qualification at Certificate IV or above
- › Be recognised as competent through a recognised training program or process against the Certificate IV in Alcohol and Other Drugs qualification or equivalent
- › Have sufficient work experience in the relevant sector to indicate likely success at this level of qualification in a job role involving:
 - › A wide range of tasks and roles in a variety of contexts, with complexity in the range and choices of actions required
 - › The exercise of discretionary judgement and decision making under general guidance.

Delivery style

The program is delivered both on campus and on the job. Training delivery combines face-to-face trainer led theory classes and practical sessions with small group and individual activities, including what if scenarios, questioning, role plays and simulations.

Students are provided with workbooks that cover all parts of the course.
